IN THE INLAND EMPIRE, OVER 8,000 STUDENTS DROP OUT OF SCHOOL ANNUALLY AND THERE ARE FEWER COLLEGE GRADUATES THAN ANY OTHER MAJOR METRO AREA IN THE STATE.

Together, we helped Danny. Danny and his three siblings often missed meals and school days as their parents were frequently unavailable. At the age of 11, Danny began selling drugs to

simply provide food and shoes for his brothers and sisters. Thanks to our support and the help of a local school partner, Danny and his siblings are all now receiving the food and tools they need to attend school and excel academically through our Kids Pack and School Tools programs.

Together, we helped Dee. Dee was a successful business woman and a single mother of two children when she lost her job. She had savings and a Masters Degree and was confident she would be fine. However, after a year of job searching, her savings were depleted and she could no longer afford health insurance. When Dee was diagnosed with cancer shortly after, it was United Way's 211 that connected her with the affordable local medical care that she now says saved her life. Dee is now healthy, successfully running a small business, and her children are thriving.



FINANCIAL STABILITY

ONE IN FIVE CHILDREN IN THE INLAND EMPIRE ARE LIVING IN POVERTY AND 164,148 FAMILIES IN SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY ARE LIVING BELOW THE SELF-SUFFICIENCY STANDARD.

Together, we helped Valerie and her four boys. Like many, Valerie was laid-off due to the recession and subsequently lost her home. She and her four sons suddenly found themselves homeless and living in parks, motels and an abandoned house while Valerie struggled to find food to feed her boys. Fortunately, she learned of a local United Way-funded shelter program in Upland, which gave her a roof over their heads, counseling, and job and life skills training. Valerie has now kept a stable job for the past two years, has a beautiful apartment for her family, and her boys are doing terrific in school. In Valerie's own words, "You changed my life."
